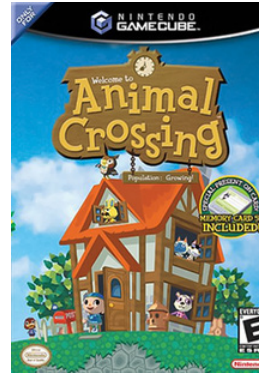

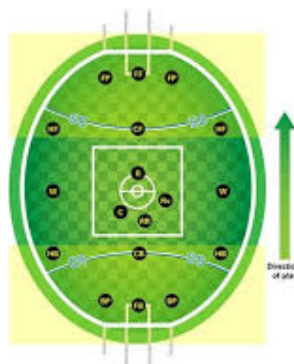

In one interview with Blend, an online magazine, he said how he was like Tame Impala, another solo artist. "It's one guy named Kevin Parker, and he writes and produces everything in his house. Kevin Parker is the mind behind it and Tame Impala tours as a band, so I'm hoping to do that with Dayglow," he said. And that's exactly what he did.

He has released one album, titled Fuzzybrain, that has ten songs on it. His best known song is titled 'Can I Call You Tonight?'

His main instrument is the six-string guitar but he can play a variety of instruments including keyboard, drums and twelve-string guitar.

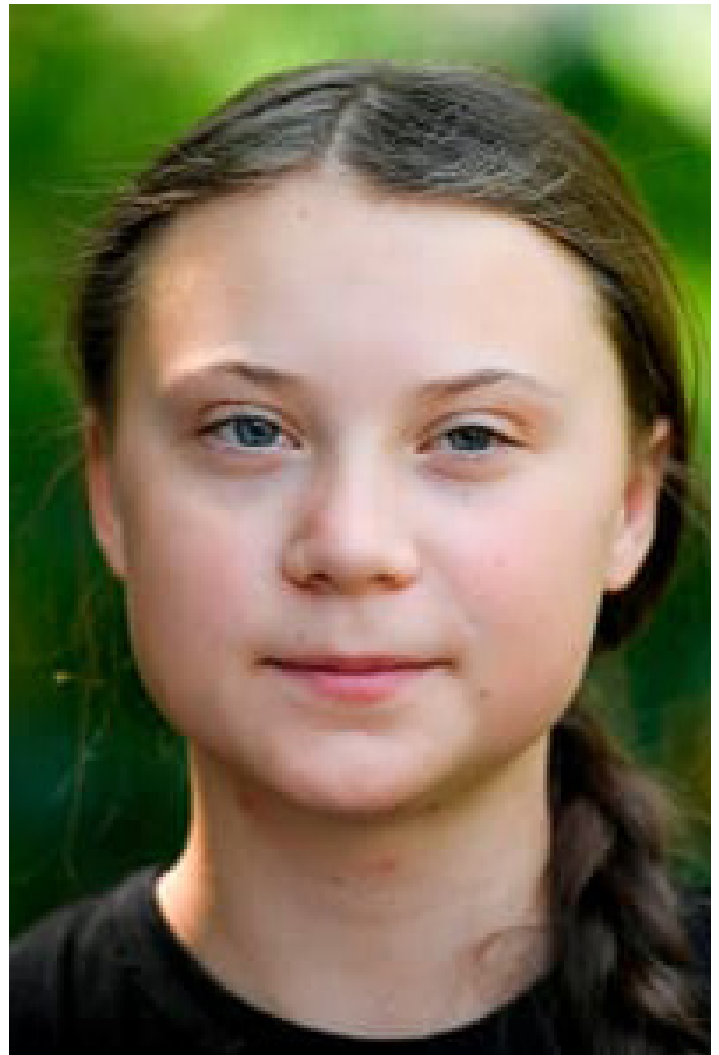

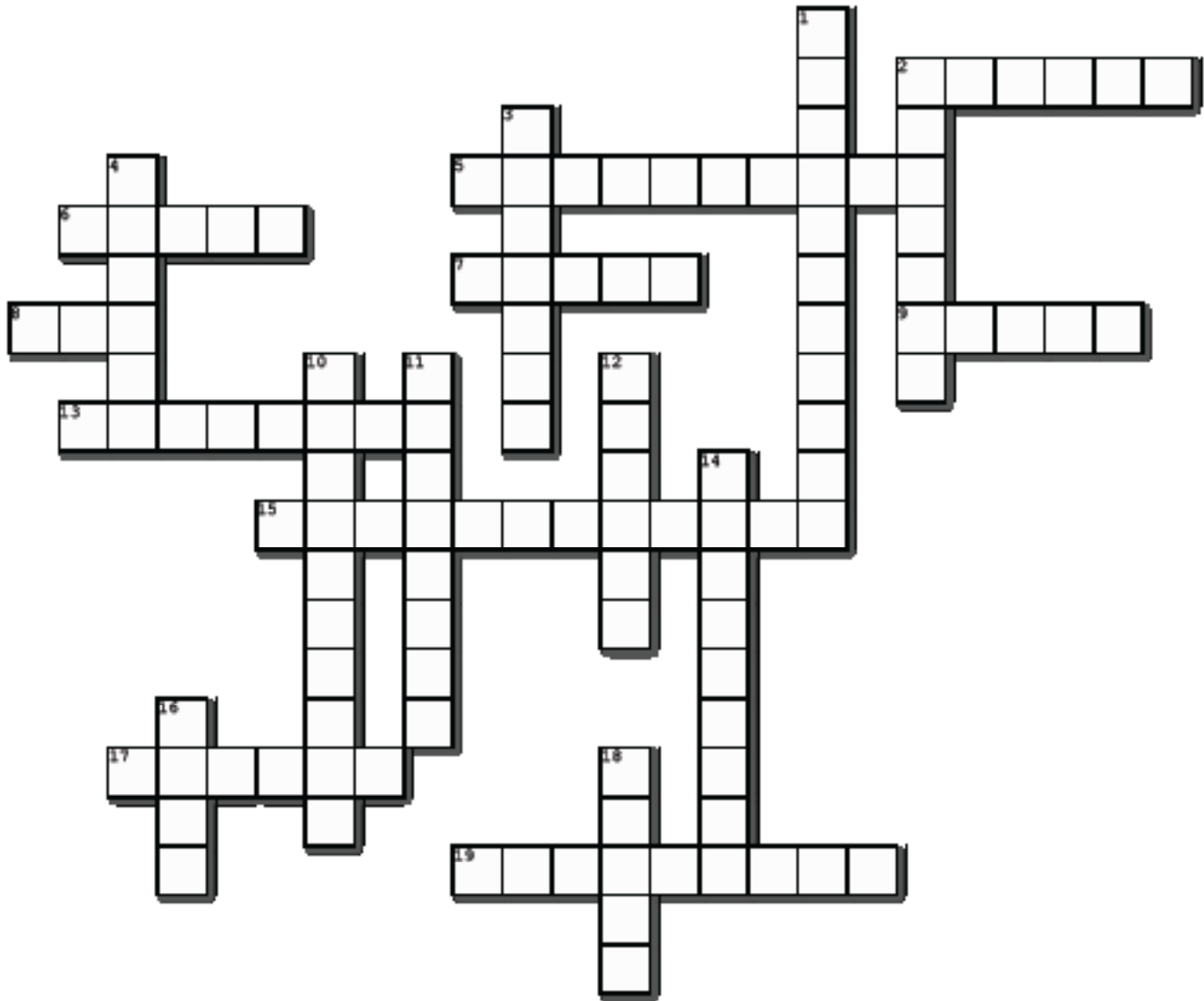

## Huskies

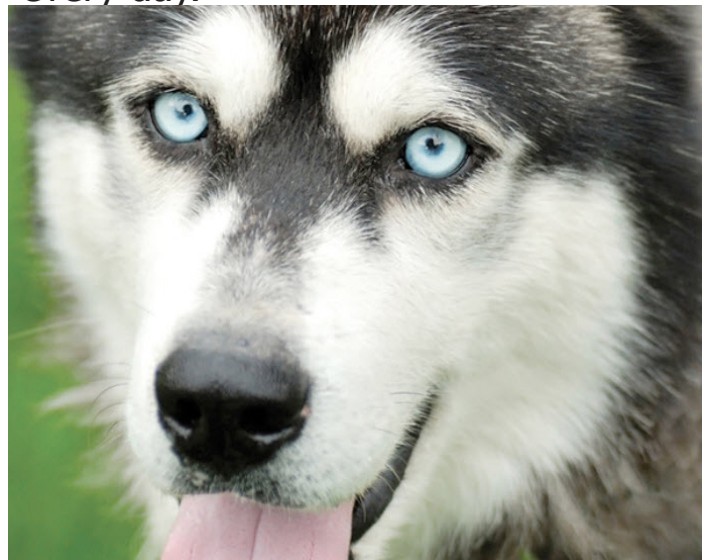

## Game Review: Super Mario Bros 35

I was very excited when I downloaded Super Mario Bros. 35. It's a new Mario game inspired by the original game released on September 13 1985 and it celebrates the 35th anniversary of Super Mario Bros.

There were also two other Super Mario games that came out for the 35th anniversary of Mario. The first one was Super Mario 3D All-Stars, which consisted of Super Mario 64, Super Mario Sunshine, and Super Mario Galaxy, all of which were massive games in Mario's saga. The other game was the Game and Watch: Super Mario Bros., which was a new limited edition Game and Watch console that was a compilation of three prior Nintendo games, Super Mario Bros., Super Mario Bros.: The Lost Levels (known as Super Mario Bros. 2 in Japan), and Ball. Both are very fun, but I really like Super Mario Bros. 35.

Super Mario Bros. 35 is basically the original Super Mario Bros., but with 35 other people. The main aim of

the game is to, 1) get to the end of the stages and, 2) be the last person surviving. But it is way harder than the original Super Mario Bros.. You see, every time you defeat, say, a goomba, it goes to a different player of the 35 other people. It goes for every other enemy, from koopa troopas, to piranha plants, even Bowser.

But with those added enemies, it takes the game from being a normal boring side-scrolling 2D platform game to a thrilling, hand shaking, full on gamer game. This is an amazing game that is great for people who grew up when Super Mario Bros. came out but also for people who like games.

It's also free, which is amazing. I rate it a 10/10. Super Mario Bros. 35 is only available on Nintendo Switch.

New rules introduced in 2020 mean that there will only be one on field referee and six more tackles are allowed rather than a penalty stoppage.

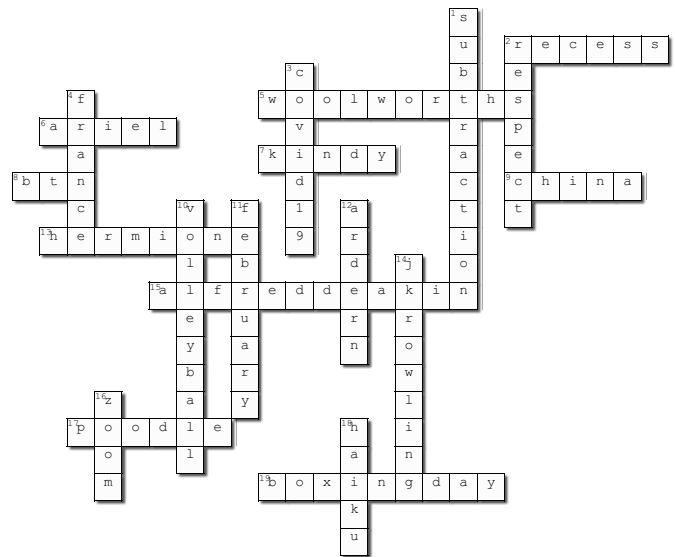
A leaderboard shows how many points/wins a team has in the season. The top 8 teams go through to the finals.

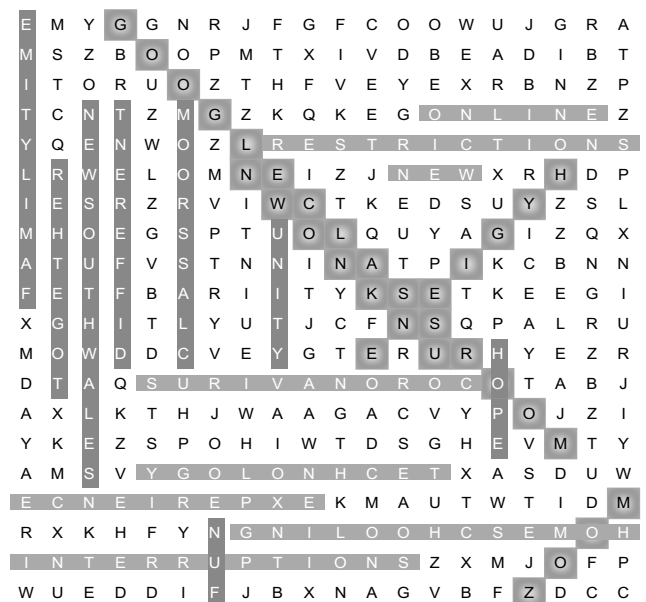
